Applicant Requirements

When participants are selected, it is with an eye toward diversity to encourage a collaboration of ideas and viewpoints. Leadership Denison is not a starting point, but rather a professional development opportunity for individuals who are both acknowledged and aspiring leaders. All candidates should demonstrate:

- * A passion for the people and future of Denison and a personal commitment to help improve the quality of life in the Texoma Area.
- * A demonstrated commitment to the community through past and current activities.
- A capacity for leadership within their own organizations through significant achievements.
- A willingness to commit the time and energy necessary to complete the program requirements, which requires full support of their organization.
- A commitment to supporting the continuation of leadership in Denison and the Texoma area.
- * A willingness to accept leadership roles within civic, charitable and community organizations.

Participation Requirements

Selected candidates must commit to the following requirements:

- Mandatory attendance at Meet & Greet, Retreat and Graduation.
- Attendance at ALL class days, with the allowance of one absence.
- Full participation breaks are provided to allow for checking of email and messages.
- A commitment to be on time, respecting the time of other candidates and presenters.

Our Tuition

Tuition can be financed up to 4 payments by the individual, employer or a sponsoring organization.

The Curriculum

Retreat

Participants begin the program by attending a full-day retreat which familiarizes them with the program. They engage in team building exercises, Strengths Assessment and examine leadership styles.

Tourism & History

Participants learn about the history of Denison and how it came to be the great city it is today. They learn why our history is a huge asset to our community, what guides tourism to our area, and why it is important to our success.

Economic & Workforce Development

Denison Development Alliance leads this full-day offering a "deep-dive" into why Denison is a great place to bring business. Workforce trends and issues facing businesses are discussed along with tours of various facilities.

City/County/State Govenrment

Leaders from our city, county and state give participants a first-hand look at how our government functions and how each organization works together for the benefit of Team Denison. They hear from leaders and elected officials and attend a Denison City Council meeting and the Grayson County Commissioners Court, if possible.

Social Services

Participants gain an understanding of the various entities that serve the social needs of our community and how the agencies are crucial to our success. They visit several non-profits and learn about their services and learn what it takes to serve on non-profit boards.

Healthcare Services

Participants learn about issues facing the healthcare industry and how Denison and the Texoma area are leaders in innovation and technology, leading the industry with the most up-to-date equipment and procedures.

Education

Participants visit Denison ISD and Grayson College and participate in discussions with educational leaders about common issues and challenges facing their institutions. They learn about the ever-changing and advancing opportunities for our youth residents.

Project

On Saturday March 21st, 2025 the class joins the City of Denison at "The BIG EVENT." A community-wide day of service, the Big Event volunteers join forces to help residents and business with outdoor cleanup and projects. Learning the value of giving back is one of the key components of Leadership Denison.
